SECTION 7.0 LONG-TERM IMPLICATIONS

Page 7.0-4, under the heading **Section 4.2 Air Quality**, the following discussion is added:

Violate Air Quality Standard: Short-Term Emissions from Construction Projects

Impact 4.2.2 Project-related construction and development over the planning horizon of the proposed project, including vegetation removal, excavation, grading, paving, operation of vehicles, painting and other construction activities, could increase the potential for air pollutants, which in turn could result in a violation of an air quality standard or in a substantial contribution to an existing or projected air quality violation. Although the proposed General Plan Update has mitigating policies and their associated action steps, along with the City, District, State and Federal Rule-Based Requirements discussed below, these efforts will not reduce the impact to a less than significant level. Therefore, this impact is considered **potentially significant**.
