


On behalf of the men and women of the Rocklin Police Department, I am pleased to present to you our 2019 Annual Report. I am proud to lead this organization and I look forward to the continued successes of the Rocklin Police Department and our community. I am very proud of our Department's staff and all of our volunteers who support the Department's Mission; to Serve, Protect and Promote a Safe Community. Our members continue to provide excellent service with skill, compassion and empathy. Residents and visitors to our City deserve to be very proud of the Rocklin Police Department and the staff who work with our community to maintain Rocklin as a premiere, safe, destination city.

This year's annual report documents a slight increase in crime for 2019 with 15.2 crimes per thousand residents, up from 15.1 crimes per thousand in 2018 but still significantly below 18.9 crimes per thousand residents in 2017. Robbery, Burglary and Vehicle Theft categories registered decreases while Rape, Aggravated Assault and Larceny registered increases of 69%, 39%, and 6% respectively. For the Rape and Aggravated Assaults categories, this represented a total of 18 additional crimes over 2019 while larceny registered an additional 39 crimes over 2019. Theft from vehicles accounted for 53% of all larceny crime for the year and 37% of our total crime. Rocklin continues to be one of the safest cities with one of the lowest crime-rates in the greater Sacramento Region and the State of California. This distinction is possible because of the hard work and dedication of our police personnel, our public safety volunteers, other City departments and the collaborative involvement of our residents and business community, assisting to keep our community safe.

The content of this report is prepared to highlight the Rocklin Police Department's statistical data from the previous year. More important than the actual data is recognizing the outstanding relationships we continue to nurture with our community. I want to thank each and every one in our community who assists us in keeping our city safe; we couldn't do it without your support. The support enjoyed by the members of the Rocklin Police Department does not go unnoticed by those who serve your community.




Rocklin's violent crime increased 29% and property crime increased 3%.


Violent Crime: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated

Property Crime: Burglary, Larceny, Vehicle Theft, Arson




Theft from vehicle (vehicle burglary) accounted for 53% of all larceny and 37% of the total crime for the year.



Since 2005, Rocklin's population has increased 40% (2.46% per year) with an average crime rate of 18.6 Part 1 crimes per 1,000 residents.



Law enforcement calls for service increased 2%, officer initiated activity increased 12% and total police incidents increased 6%





Priority 1 – Emergency situations requiring immediate police response


Priority 2 – Incidents where the situation may escalate into an emergency


Priority 3 – Non-emergency and report incidents that do not require an emergency response











Overall, injury and non-injury collisions increased by 9%. Hit and run collisions decreased by 17%.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

The Professional Standards Unit (PSU) is responsible for protecting the integrity and reputation of the police department. The PSU's duties range from managing the agency's accreditation process, to overseeing the complaint and commendation process of police personnel.

The Rocklin Police Department has been a nationally accredited agency for the past eleven years. Accreditation is awarded by the Commission on Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). Rocklin PD participates in this voluntary process to pursue excellence, and to ensure the highest law enforcement standards are maintained.






