The fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, report included the Rocklin Road/Sierra College Corridor Multimodal Project, scheduled to commence in FY 2024/25. This project has since been divided into three distinct projects: the Sunset Boulevard Widening, Rocklin Road Widening, and Sierra College Boulevard Widening, as outlined above.

Technology fee expense totaled \$43,412, accounting for a fair share allocation for ecommerce. Indirect cost allocation totaled \$32,130, accounting for central service costs. Engineering allocation totaled \$9,250, accounting for engineering costs associated with the public improvements.
