

## Introduction

In April/May 2024, the City of Rocklin hosted an online survey for Sierra College students as part of the Rocklin Road Sierra College Corridor Multimodal Enhancements Project. The survey was available online from April 22 – May 20, 2024, receiving 110 responses. The survey aimed to obtain feedback from Sierra College students on their current travel patterns along the project corridor, their current modes, and how safe they feel while traveling. The feedback collected through the student survey will inform the project's engineering and design phase.

### About the Project


The City of Rocklin is studying the feasibility of reconstructing the Interstate 80 and Rocklin Road Interchange between Sierra College and downtown Rocklin to provide a safer connection for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, and motorists and close the gap between communities caused by Interstate 80.

### Survey Methodology

When participants visited the online survey page, they were able to learn more about the Rocklin Road Sierra College Corridor Multimodal Enhancements Project, its goals, and the project area. The survey included eight questions covering the following topics:

- Preferred mode of travel
- How safe and comfortable they feel traveling along the project corridor
- Most visited local destinations
- Frequency of travel along the corridor

### Awareness and Notification



#### Student Survey on SurveyMonkey

The project team implemented a community outreach and education campaign to increase student participation in the survey.

• <u>Social Media:</u> The City of Rocklin posted the survey on its Instagram account on May 15th and on its Facebook page on <u>May 16<sup>th</sup></u>. The project team also posted a boosted advertisement on Facebook and Instagram targeting Rocklin area residents.



- <u>Stakeholder Communication</u>: More than 30 college staff members who facilitate student clubs or organizations were contacted via email and phone about the survey. Staff were willing to both take and share the survey with other students.
- <u>Flyer Delivery:</u> The project team delivered survey flyers to Campus Cafés, student service rooms, and the library and posted them on bulletin boards across campus.
- <u>Pop-Ups:</u> Project team members attended the Sierra College campus twice:
  - The first event was held at the ECOS Earth Day event on April 25<sup>th</sup>. After engaging with students, project team members distributed survey cards and encouraged attendees to take the survey.

- The second event took place at the Rocklin Sierra College Campus quad. More than 100 survey cards\_were distributed to students.
- <u>Email Notification</u>: The project team sent an email notification with a final reminder to take the survey to a public database of 646 contacts in Rocklin.
- <u>College Class Awareness:</u> Two Sierra College professors agreed to share the survey with their classes. The students who took the student survey were offered extra credit in the class.











## Student Feedback

Question 1: How often do you leave campus to travel on the Rocklin Road/I-80 Corridor?






# Question 2: Do you have a car?









Question 3: In general, how do you travel along the corridor?
